## Trout hurls no-hitter in Millville victory

Mike Trout turned in the best pitching performance of the young high school baseball season Monday, when he hurled a no-hitter as Millville posted a 6-0 victory over visiting Egg Harbor Township in a Cape-Atlantic League American Division I contest.

Trout was overpowering as he went to 2-0 on the season. He recorded 18 of the 21 outs by strikeout and issued just three walks.

Colonial: Jake Rifkin turned in a strong pitching performance, and home runs by Steve Jakubowski and Scott Renauro powered West Deptford to a 3-1 win over visiting Haddonfield.

Tyler Smith hurled shutout ball over six innings and allowed just four hits as Haddon Township topped Gateway, 3-1. Ian Lindsay and Nate Engel each had three hits to spark the Hawks' offense.

Kyle Falzone was the winning pitcher and helped his own cause with a homer as Collingswood downed host Lindenwold, 7-5. Paulsboro scored four runs in the bottom of the seventh inning to down Woodbury, 7-6.

Olympic: Cherry Hill East erased a 4-3 deficit with four runs in the top of the seventh inning to post a 7-4 American Division win over Cherokee.

Jeff Bohus, who homered earlier in the game, hit a key double to highlight the Cougars' four-run seventh inning.

In another American Division game, Washington Township kept Eastern winless by breaking a tie with two runs in the top of the seventh inning to earn a 13-11 win.

Justin Ondrejko's two-run single in the seventh produced the winning runs for Township.

Anthony DiPalmo's single drove in the tying run in the bottom of the seventh inning and helped Triton earn a 3-3 11-inning deadlock with Winslow Township in the Patriot Division.

Tri-County: Tedd Teschner hurled a five-hitter and Art Knapp singled home the lone run of the game as Highland edged Delsea, 1-0, in a Royal Division battle.

Gage Mick had two hits, drove in a run and also picked up a two-inning save as Cumberland topped Deptford, 4-3.

Gloucester Catholic scored nine runs in the first inning and posted a 16-6 Diamond Division win over Woodstown.

Reggie Jackson hurled a five-hitter and had five strikeouts as Overbrook stayed unbeaten with a 14-1 win over Schalick.

Jon Coppage had eight strikeouts and gave up just three hits in leading Penns Grove past Glassboro, 7-0.

Brandon Hyson and Brett Burdsall combined for a strong pitching effort, and Terry Hogate blasted a homer as Pennsville topped Gloucester, 3-1, in a Classic Division game.

Burlington County: Max Himmelstein hit a pair of home runs in leading Moorestown past Rancocas Valley, 6-5, in a Liberty Division game.

Dillon O'Neal's single in the bottom of the seventh inning plated the winning run as Riverside nipped New Egypt, 4-3, in a Freedom Division game.

Mike Loffredo allowed just two singles over five innings and Dane Handy drove in four runs with a homer and a single as Holy Cross downed Burlington Township, 10-0, in a Patriot Division game.
